Raywin Melmore Raaflaub passed away on April 20, 2023 after a brief illness. He was born in Magnetawan, on 19 August 1930. His name came from the first three letters of his grandparents' names, Raymond and Winnifred Raaflaub (Rawn). With such an unusual name, it is no wonder that his life was so inspired, exciting and varied; from being a wildcatter in the Alberta oilfields to guarding our Arctic borders at DEW line radar stations. He, along with his father and four brothers, served in Canada's armed forces. He was always loyal to his friend AC1 Stanley Peacock and helped organize the annual memorial services at his gravesite on 13 October. Seeing him whizzing around on his electric scooter was a sight to behold. The Indy 500 had nothing on him. He was always grateful to his friend and confidant, Karen, who helped him get around otherwise to grocery shop and spirit him from one venue to another. He valued his friendships with his RCAF family and the Legion members. Ray had four children Ted (Gayle), Debbie (Greg), Richard and Lisa (Brad). He had 6 grandchildren and 5 great grandchildren. His family very much appreciated the Celebration of Life service that 441 Wing conducted in his honour at the Orillia RCL Branch 34 on 7 May 2023. Ray's final wish was for his friends at the Wing to have a drink in his honour at his funeral. His cousin, Dr. Garry Lee Willard proposed the toast to the Wing members present.
