
#### 1. RCAF Association Mission Statement:






# 4. <u>Last Flight:</u>

# 6. Battle of Britain Commemorations 2023:



The 83rd Anniversary of the Battle of Britain was commemorated by 441 (Huronia) Wing at Barrie City Hall on Monday, 11 September, 2023. Barrie's Mayor Alex Nuttall declared the week of 11 - 17 September as Battle of Britain Week in Barrie. He was joined by MP John Brassard, MPP Andrea Khanjin, a

member of RCAFA 441 (Huronia) Wing, and representatives of MP Doug Shipley and MPP Doug Downey as he hoisted the RCAFA Ensign to honour the 'Few'. The following Sunday morning, 17 September, the 441 (Huronia) Wing Honour Guard and several 441 Wing members attended the 16 Wing Borden Battle of Britain Commemoration service at the RCAF Cairn in Borden. CTV News Barrie was there and the Wing received good coverage on the evening news.

# 7. Remembrance Day Commemorations:



For this year's Remembrance Day Commemoration, the City of Barrie and the Barrie Legion have agreed to hold a parade along Dunlop Street with a service at the Barrie Cenotaph on the 11th of Nov. The parade will march off at 1030 hrs with Fern Taillefer as the Parade Marshal. Rogers Cable TV will broadcast

the ceremony live that morning and will also arrange for the ceremony to be streamed to the internet. For other services in the surrounding area, please see below:

**Stayner** - Royal Canadian Legion Branch 457 will be holding Remembrance Day ceremonies at the cenotaph in front of the Clearview Township municipal offices on Gideon Street. Parade form-up is at 10:30 a.m. in the parking area on Huron Street.

**Penetanguishene** – Events held at the Memorial Park cenotaph. Parade at 10:15 a.m. with ceremonies starting shortly before at 11 a.m.

**Midland** – Service begins at 11 a.m. at the cenotaph on King Street. It is preceded by a parade featuring members of Royal Canadian Legion Branch 80, the Midland Police Service, the Midland Fire Department and others.

**New Lowell** – Ceremony of Remembrance starts at 10:30 a.m. at Royal Canadian Legion New Lowell. Chili and hot chocolate will be served inside after the service.

**Alliston** - The ceremony will feature the unveiling of a second wall mural on the west side of the Alliston Memorial Arena. To catch the bus to the cenotaph, be at the legion by 10 a.m. A reception will be held after the service at the Alliston Legion, 111 Dufferin St. S. A dinner will be held at the legion later in the evening. Cocktails are at 6 p.m. and dinner is at 7 p.m. The guest speaker is Retired Lt.-Col Greg Stasyna.

**Angus -** The parade forms up outside the Angus Legion at 10:30 a.m. and a service will follow at the cenotaph. A reception will be held at the legion after the service.

**Collingwood** - Remembrance Day ceremonies take place the cenotaph at The Station on St. Paul Street in Collingwood at 11 a.m. This is followed by lunch at the Legion.

The Blue Mountains - ceremonies take place at Jack Acres Park Cenotaph, Russell Street, Thornbury, at 11 a.m., followed by a ceremony at Ravenna Hall Park Cenotaph on Grey Road 119 in Ravenna at 1 p.m.

**Elmvale** - Cenotaph outside of the Elmvale Library. The parade leaves the Elmvale Legion at 10:30 a.m. and arrives at the Elmvale Cenotaph just prior to 11 a.m.

**Springwater Park** - Assembling at 10 a.m. A Remembrance Day Ceremony in honour of the Vespra Boys and all who fought so we may be free. The gates will be open to the public for this event and no parking fees will be required.

**Midland** - The service begins at 11 a.m. At the cenotaph on King Street. It is preceded by a parade featuring members of Royal Canadian Legion Branch 80, the Midland Police Service, the Midland Fire Department and others.

Orillia - Orillia Legion Branch 34 Remembrance Day memorial service and wreath laying ceremony at Cenotaph, Orillia Soldiers' Memorial Hospital, followed by parade down Mississaga Street and reception with Veterans at Legion, 215 Mississaga Street East at waterfront, 705-325-8442. Buses depart Legion at 10 a.m. and the Cenotaph Ceremony is at 10:45 a.m.

# 8. Honouring AC2 Stanley Peacock on 13 October, 2023:

On Thursday 13 October 2023, Royal Canadian Air Cadet AC1 Stanley Peacock was honoured at a wreath laying ceremony at his grave in St. James' Anglican Cemetery, Orillia. AC1 Peacock was killed 80 years ago while helping as an electrician's apprentice to build a Fairmile Motor Torpedo Boat at the Hunter Boats shipyard on 13 Oct 1943. The annual commemoration was initiated by the late Raywin Raaflaub, a friend of Stanley Peacock's in 99 RCAC Sqn, Orillia. The moving ceremony included the 441 Wing Colour Party. The service consisted of the traditional Last Post, minute of silence, the Rouse by Tony Beresford, the Act of Remembrance, the reading of "High Flight" by Norm Marion, the laying of a wreath in memory of AC1 Peacock by his family members who were escorted by RCL Branch #34 President Rick Purcell, and a Closing Prayer by Legion Padre Gerry McMullen. In addition to the ten members of 441 Wing present were Orillia

Mayor Don McIssac, OPP Inspector Cover Yateman, Fire Chief Michael Clark, Bugler Tony Beresford. along with RCL Branch #34 Pres Rick Purcell and Rob McCron & three members of Stanley Peacock's family. Members of 441 Wing then walked over to Rav Raaflaub's grave and laid a wreath in his memory before going to the Orillia Legion.



#### 12. Scott MacLagan has written a book called 'Cold War Over Canada':

441 Wing member Scott MacLagan has written a book called 'COLD WAR OVER CANADA' where he writes about what it was like to be in the Cold War in the late 50's. Maclagan, 86, was a backseat navigator and radar operator until 1959 when he was grounded for eyesight deterioration. He decided to write about his story while being isolated by the COVID-19 pandemic. "I wrote this story to get recognition for my pilot," he said. "We saved three other aircraft during our time together by guiding them into emergency landings." Without the exceptional piloting talents of Dave Strachan, Maclagan says he and other RCAF members wouldn't be alive today. It was just published. Congratulations, Scott!

# 14. <u>TIME CAPSULE: "The VC and Ian Willoughby Bazalgette, DFC</u> by Randolf Rice

From 3 Sep 1939 to 8 May 1945, RAF Bomber Command lost a total of 8,325 aircraft on operations in Europe. In human terms, this overall loss represented 47,268 individual aircrew members killed in action (one of which Ian would become). Faced with the prospect of an initial tour of operations comprising a nominal 30 sorties before being temporarily 'rested', the life expectancy of any member of a bomber crew was slim; enter Squadron Leader Ian Bazalgette RCAF.

During the Second World War, the RCAF grew to a strength of 249,662 with 38 Squadrons serving overseas. Of that number 28,000 Canadian aircrew personnel served with RAF units.

Born of English parents in Calgary, Alberta on 19 Oct 1918, Ian Bazalgette attended early school in Canada and, in 1927, he was brought to England to complete his education. On 16 Jul 1939, he enlisted in the Royal Artillery (RA) and was promoted as a Second Lieutenant on 7 Sep 1940; serving initially with the Searchlight Section, RA, and later as an instructor. With little hope of active fighting, Ian volunteered for the RAF, where he was officially promulgated as a Pilot Officer, RAFVR with effect from 24 Jan 1942 and posted to 115 Squadron to fly Wellington aircraft.

By the time Squadron Leader Bazalgette's day with destiny arrived, he was a bomber veteran having completed one complete tour of operations. It was at this time he stated to a fellow pilot, "3 Group finished me after completing my 29th trip". For a short time, he was temporarily 'rested' as an instructor. When word was circulated that the RAF was looking for experienced bomber crews for the famed Pathfinder bombers, Ian jumped at the opportunity and was accepted after completing the required training to the famed 635 (Pathfinder) Squadron.

On 12 Jun 1944, England suffered its first attack by V1 flying bombs and Bomber Command was tasked with the destruction of the V1 launching sites along the French coastal areas. In the first two weeks of July, Bazalgette flew six more sorties against V1 sites, railway yards, and German troop concentrations; three of which saw him either marking or illuminating the target. His 54th operational sortie was a daylight raid on Chappel Notre Dame on 1 Aug 1944, on which he was yet again selected as deputy to the Master Bomber. On 4 Aug, the Pathfinder Force (PFF) mounted a daylight raid on another V1 site. The raid consisted of 61 Lancasters with 635 Squadron as the Pathfinder Sqn that would mark this important target. Of the 14 crews from 635 Sqn, Ian was the Master Bomber. His crew consisted of six men, a very cohesive team, one of whom was loaned to Bazalgette for this particular sortie in place of the regular mid-upper gunner. In the aircraft behind his came his Deputy Master Bomber, Beveridge,

running across the target to assess markers for accuracy. Beveridge's Lancaster received direct hits, erupted in flames, and dove into the ground at high bore. Flak was everywhere and Ian's aircraft was blanketed by it. Through the barrage came Bazalgette's Lanc, hellbent on dropping his markers accurately. In the ensuing fire storm, his Lancaster was hit in several places including both starboard engines, which were knocked out of action, the starboard wing was on fire and flames licked along the fuselage. In addition, Flight Lieutenant I.A. Hibberd, the bomb aimer, had his arm and part of his shoulder shot away and was given morphine. In the mid-upper gun turret, Flight Sgt Leeder, RAAF, was overcome by fumes.





Things were now critical within the flaming inferno, fuel and smoke everywhere. this point Bazalgette maintained control of his aircraft to finish his marking run while his crew fought to manage the injured and control the fires. But it was too late, after consulting with his Flight Engineer, Sergeant George Turner, Ian managed to get the aircraft to 1000 feet and gave the command to bale out. At this point the

remaining four members of the crew obeyed their skipper and out they went, while Ian, considering the two injured aircrew aboard, thought a landing was possible. Approaching the village of Senantes, FR, he was seen to turn away from a cluster of buildings and let down in a nearby field. The Lancaster touched down in a perfect landing-then exploded.

The four baled-out crew members were rescued by the Marquis and hidden till war's end when Ian Bazalgette's gallantry was revealed by his surviving crew. At the crash site locals retrieved Ian's remains and he was buried in the local cemetery, while those of Hibberd and Leeder were whisked away by the Germans.

On the 18 Dec 1945, Squadron Leader Bazalgette's Victoria Cross, DFC, and other decorations were presented to his mother at an investiture.

### 15. RCAF 100th Anniversary Lapel Pins:

Following a well-established tradition, commemorative pins will be produced again in 2024 to mark the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Royal Canadian Air Force on April 1st, 1924. Norm Marion proposed four (4) aircraft for the 2024 pin. They were: the AVRO 504 – a fighter aircraft that represents the birth years of the

RCAF (1923-1924); the Vickers Vedette – an amphibius aircraft that was the first new aircraft ordered by and delivered to the RCAF (1923-1924); the Sopwith Camel – the fighter aircraft flown by First World War Ace William (Billy) Barker; and the Armstrong Whitworth (AW) Siskin – a new advanced bi-plane fighter aircraft that was entered service in 1928. The Siskin was used as a training aircraft at Camp Borden (the birthplace of the RCAF) and was Canada's first aerial display aircraft. The AW Siskin was selected by the Wing membership as the aircraft to grace the RCAF 100th Anniversary pin. Norm has approached Bob Thompson about producing the graphics. The directors voted for the Wing to purchase 200 pins for 2024.
