3. <u>Last Flight:</u>

William "Bill" Edwin Buck: April 1, 1930 - January 5, 2024

Bill Buck was born in Windsor, ON in 1930 to parents Margaret and Harold Buck (deceased). Bill was known for his ability in sports, in high school, including swimming, basketball, and baseball. His skills in baseball drew the attention of major league scouts and he was drafted by the Toledo Mud Hens Baseball team, a Detroit Tigers minor league farm club team. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Cadets, was awarded a scholarship, traveling to Great Britain on an Air Cadets international Exchange. The die was cast, and upon his return, he finished high school and enlisted in the RCAF.

Shortly after joining the RCAF, Bill married Sophia Andrashuski (deceased)



from St. Thomas, while in basic flight training. At the end of the Korean War pilots were no longer needed in substantial numbers, so Bill re-mustered into Physical Education Training. Bill and his young growing family, served in France at RCAF 2-Wing Grostenquin. Upon his return to Canada, he served in Centralia and Base Borden. While in Borden he served on a 6-month peace keeping mission in Cyprus. After his return to Canada, he was stationed, to RCAF Base Gimli, MB, as the BPERO, and he organized Gimli Air Shows, and he was the drum major for the Gimli RCAF Marching band. Returning to Base Borden in 1966, he was assigned the task of training soldiers from across the military to perform in the Expo 67 Cross Canada Cdn Forces Military Tattoo.

After Borden, the family transferred to CFE Lahr, West Germany where he was BPERO for Baden and Lahr Physical Education programs. Bill and family returned to CFB Kingston where he was tasked with training officials and field judges for the 1976 Montreal Olympic Games. His final posting was to CFB London, where he ended his 31-year career in the military – but not before serving with another UN Peacekeeping Force in Egypt as his retirement gig. Through his life's journey, Bill managed to compete in twenty-one marathons and countless other shorter competitions over 4 decades. Upon retiring from the military, Bill worked with Stinson Security Services. His final retirement job was at Western University Hospital, London, as Manager of Security and Protective Services.

Bill and Sophia had four children, Richard Buck, wife Barbara Buck (deceased) with three children Tiffany, Melissa and Brandon, daughter Penny (Buck) Fettinger with two children Keith and Jamie, daughter Heather Buck and daughter Patricia (Buck) Wright, husband of The Rev. Canon Dr. Robert Wright and have two sons Benjamin and Sean. Bill met and married Jean MacDonald Buck (deceased) and they lived at Big Bay Point.

Bill's Celebration of Life was held Saturday, February 3, 2024, at 1:00 pm, at St. Paul's Anglican Church, 54 St. Paul's Crescent, Barrie (Innisfil), L4N 0M2.

4. Ad Astal Place Flags Fly at Half Mast in Honour of PM Brian Mulroney:

Former Canadian Prime Minister and Conservative stalwart Brian Mulroney has died at age 84. The former Tory leader died peacefully, surrounded by family, on Thursday, 29 February, 2024. His tenure as prime minister was marked by momentous economic change and two tumultuous attempts to reform the Canadian Constitution. A state funeral for him will be held on Saturday, 23 March 2024. The flags at Ad Astral place will fly at half mast until the end of his state funeral as a sign of respect for him.

5. <u>RCAF Association Cairn in Honour of the RCAF 100th Anniversary:</u>

Our Wing has made a \$700 donation (\$10 per member) towards the Cairn that will be unveiled on 28 Sept 2024 at the National Air Force Museum of Canada in Trenton. Other members of our Wing have generously made private donations as well. Ontario Group Chair, Walter Peckham has been the prime mover behind this initiative and needed at least half of the \$18,000 required in advance to proceed with ordering the Cairn. 8. <u>Honours and Awards</u>:

Andy Galton and his H&A Committee have been busy doing the write-ups for the 2023 awards. The awards and the membership pins will be given out at the Charter and Awards meeting on Tuesday, 14 May 2024 at the Barrie Legion. This format was decided on since there are so many other activities going on in commemoration of the RCAF 100th. You will hear more about this as plans are firmed up.

9. <u>Illumination Blue Light - Celebrating the RCAF 100th Anniversary:</u> April 1st is just around the corner to light up in BLUE many heritage buildings, monuments and more on that date. 441 (Huronia) Wing will be participating in this nation-wide project. Several local Royal Canadian Legion branches have agreed to take part, including Branch #147 in Barrie. The city of Bradford has agreed to have its city hall and public library participate in this project too, with a total of 300 buildings participating in Canada. As a side benefit of this project, should sufficient municipalities and organizations participate in it, it could be considered for a Guinness Book of World Records entry. Based on the parameters given to us by Guinness, the Legions qualify as a landmark. On top of a photo requirement, Guinness World Records requires the following:

• All landmarks must remain illuminated for a minimum of 10 minutes at their respective time of illumination. Timestamped video evidence of each landmark illuminated must be provided.

11. <u>TIME CAPSULE: "Air Marshal George Mitchell Croil, CAF, RCAF":</u> By Randolf Rice

The Royal Canadian Air Force came into being on April 1st, 1924; however, at the time it remained a department of the Air Ministry. It remained so until 1938 and the efforts of one man to effect an historic change. That man was Air Vice Marshall George Mitchell Croil who due to his unrelenting drive to make the RCAF a strong independent National Air Force saw his vision come to fruition. On November 19th, 1938 an Air Council was formed and he was appointed its first Chief of the Air Staff. At the same time the Air Force as a whole was organized into three Air Commands: Western, Eastern, and Air Training Command.

George Mitchell Croil was born on June 5th, 1893 in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, USA. On graduation from Robert Gordon College in Scotland he studied Civil Engineering obtaining а British Engineering Certificate. When the Great War erupted, Croil was commissioned in the British Infantry. He was seconded to the Royal Flying Corp (RFC) in 1916 and after two months of flying traing was awarded his wings. He was then transferred to the RFC as a Flying Officer. As a pilot flying bombers he saw service with No. 47 Squadron in the Mediterranean On occasion he flew the famed T.E. theatre. Lawrence to various desert camps. At wars end, Croil had logged in excess of 1,100 hours flying time on 18 aircraft types. On June 3, 1919 he was



awarded the Air Force Cross for his service in the Middle East. In 1920, he returned to Canada and was appointed to the Canadian Air Board (CAB) after which he left in 1923 and joined the Canadian Air Force (CAF) as Squadron Leader. Between the wars, Croil served at various Air Force Stations and attended numerous military courses, always advocating for an independent National Air Force. Of particular note, George Mitchell Croil served as Station Commander from December 5th, 1927 to December 9th, 1932 at Camp Borden, near Barrie. In January 1935, he was promoted to Air Commodore (A/C) and won admission to a seat on the Defence Council. On August 4th, 1938, Croil succeeded, after extensive lobbying, in removing supervision over the RCAF by the Army's Chief of the General Staff (ACGS) office when he was promoted to the minister of National Defence. His goal had been achieved.

A reserved man, strict and professional AVM Croil stood out as a conscientious and dedicated officer. Due to these personality traits, when war broke out in 1939, he clashed with the Minister for Air, Chubby Power and was asked to step down in 1940. Less than a year later, Power was replaced as Minister for Air! During the war years, Croil was responsible for the development of the British Commonwealth Air Training Plan and was appointed Inspector-General of the RCAF.

In March 1953, a 171,200 square foot Technical Training School was dedicated as Croil Hall at RCAF Station Camp Borden and continues to this day to train air personnel for the RCAF. I had the privilege of working at Croil Hall during my Air Force career.

Air Marshal (Lieutenant-General) George Mitchell Croil passed away on April 8th, 1959, in Vancouver, British Columbia, a dream fulfilled.

12. <u>RCAF 100th Anniversary Memorial Banners for Barrie:</u>

The Wing's Committee overseeing the design and production of the RCAF 100th Anniversary Banners are finalizing them with the printers. Of the 22 names that they had, they were able to get pictures and permission to produce 15 of them. These banners will be hung in the rotunda of Barrie's city hall for the last week of March and the month of April. It has been proposed that there be a formal dedication ceremony around the 4th weekend of March to dedicate the indoor banners. All family and Wing members will be invited to the ceremony. CTV News Barrie will also be invited to cover the event. On 7th of March, Cheri Harris had good news for the Wing: the city will pay for the production of 13 outdoor banners that will be displayed in honour of the RCAF 100th. The committee quickly put together a new design and sent the template to her for production.

13. <u>RCAF 100th Anniversary Lapel Pins:</u>



Following a well-established Borden tradition, commemorative pins are to be produced again in 2024 to mark the 100th anniversary of the birth of the RCAF on April 1st, 1924. This year's pin, selected by the membership, is the Armstrong Whitworth Siskin. It was a new advanced bi-plane fighter aircraft that entered service in 1928. The Siskin was used as a training aircraft at Camp Borden (the birthplace of the RCAF) and was Canada's first aerial display aircraft. Norm Marion has ordered 200 lapel pins for the Wing that will be sold during 2024.

14. <u>RCAF 100th Anniversary T-33 Parkette – Status Update:</u>

Rudy Mak has almost finished the preparation of the Parkette area for displaying CT-133443. The bases for the flag poles and info signs were installed. The front 3 gardens have been planted with 1200 tulip bulbs. Good news from Ottawa, DND has signed off on the release of the aircraft so ownership can now be handed over to Clearwater Township. We now need volunteers and a site to work on it. In the event we cannot get one on Base, Rudy has a hangar at Edenvale that can be used, however, it's not heated and would involve trucking twice, but at least it's a backup.
