#### AIR HISTORY – APRIL 2017

#### **Ballistic Missile Defense**

Missile defense has been largely off the public and political radar since then-Prime Minister Paul Martin famously opted not to join the U.S. program following a heated and extremely divisive national debate in 2005. Prime Minister Justin Trudeau's Liberal government has signaled its willingness to reopen one of the most contentious debates in recent Canadian military history: whether the country should participate in Ballistic Missile Defense. And hopefully the results could be very different this time around. The question of whether Canada should reconsider its decision not to join the United States in building a shield to protect North America from foreign-launched missiles has been raised as part of the government's comprehensive Defense review. Defense Minister Harjit Sajjan released a document asking for public feedback on what the military should – and should not – be doing. "Given the increase in the number of countries with access to Ballistic Missile technology and their potential to reach North America, this threat is expected to endure and grow more sophisticated in the coming decades," reads the document.

Canada's partners and allies are working together on Ballistic Missile Defense while Canada remains outside such efforts. The U.S. pressed ahead with Missile Defense, spending about \$100 billion over the last decade to develop land - and sea-based systems that would stop a limited Ballistic Missile attack from a rogue state like North Korea or Iran. (They would not protect against an all-out attack by Russia or China.) The programs, which have had mixed success in testing, have been developed in co-operation with NATO allies as well as Australia and South Korea. It should be noted that Canada has publicly supported Missile Defense in Europe. Supporters, including Military officials, experts and the head of the Senate Defense Committee, are confident that the circumstances are now necessary for Canada to participate. Conservative and Liberal members of the Senate Defense Committee including Canadian National Hero, retired General Romeo Dallaire, had three years ago, unanimously called for Canada to join the U.S. in building a Ballistic Missile Defense.

Briefing notes obtained by the Citizen show Defense officials have also quietly set the stage by warning successive Defense ministers, including Rob Nicholson, Jason Kenney and, most recently, Sajjan about the threat posed by Ballistic Missiles from rogue states and other actors. Officials have also noted that many of Canada's allies and partners – "including all of NATO – are now engaged in Missile Defense activities, "And they called the program much more effective, "even though the system is still in heavy development and testing. Thomas Karako, a senior fellow at the Washington, D.C.-based Centre for Strategic and International Studies, believes the U.S. would welcome Canada's involvement. He also says there are several ways that Canada could contribute, such as hosting interceptors or even providing command-and-control capabilities. L/Gen. Pierre St. Amand, Deputy Commander of the Joint U.S.-Canadian Aerospace Defense System, NORAD stated "There's nothing specific that I can talk about when asked about direct threats, "The fact that we have signed up to certain alliances, NATO, for example, and we are closely aligned with the United States, means we are in a sphere where we could be targeted."

A 2016 briefing note prepared for Prime Minister Justin Trudeau noted the U.S. U.K., Australia and New Zealand have all updated their Cybersecurity Strategies, with the U.S. planning to spend \$24 billion to bolster the country's defences. Canada is still operating under a Cybersecurity Plan devised in 2010. And compared with the updated plans of the other "Five Eyes" countries, Ottawa spends comparatively little to protect the public and private systems that underpin everything from online banking to the government's top-secret network. The briefing note was prepared by Canada's most senior public servant, Michael Wernick, and obtained under access to information law. Australian Prime Minister Malcolm Turnbull also appointed a new minister of Cybersecurity, as well as an adviser and "Cyber Ambassador." Turnbull called Cybersecurity the "new frontier of warfare."
