1. RCAF Mission Statement:

2. <u>Last Flight</u>:

Our Wing sends out its heartfelt condolences to all of the families and friends of the Canadians involved in the three tragedies that occurred between 18 April and 17 May. Our Wing flew the RCAF Ensign at half mast at Ad Astral Place on Anne Street in Barrie in honour of the victims. This tribute was to the 22 people murdered in Nova Scotia on 18 & 19 April, the six Canadian Armed Forces personnel who died in HMCS Fredericton's helicopter crash off the coast of Greece on 29 April, and Captain Jenn Casey of Nova Scotia, a proud member of the Canadian Forces Snowbirds team. Casey, a public affairs officer for the Snowbirds, died on Sunday, 17 May, 2020. The six CAF members who died in the helicopter crash were:

5. Milestone Birthdays:



Two of our Wing members celebrated significant milestone birthdays in May. On Thursday, May 14, Pilot Officer (ret'd) **Tom Leonard** RCAF #R83607, turned 100 years young! He joined the RCAF as ground crew on 25 November 1940 and transferred to aircrew in 1942, training at No. 1 Bombing and Gunnery School at RCAF Station Jarvis, ON, as a Navigator "B" (Bomb Aimer before moving on to Air Navigation School, which he completed at No. 10 Air Observer School in Chatham, NB. He also did some of his aircrew training in PEI prior to shipping overseas to the UK on 26 May 1943. After conversion training on Wellington Mk 13s at RAF Haverfordwest, Wales (# 3 Operational Training Unit), he

served with 8 Sqn in Aden (Yemen). His Sqn was responsible for covering the eastern portion of the Indian Ocean, and its sister squadron, 244 Sqn, was responsible for covering the western portion of the Indian Ocean. He was in the Gulf from November 1943 until January 1945. Tom demobilized from the RCAF in March 1945. Below are two video clips from Tom's birthday drive-by celebration on the 14th. The first is from the CTV News Barrie and the second is from his son Bruce. It shows Tom saluting the RCAF Ensign as it goes past him that evening. His time served in the RCAF very much defined the type of person that he is today.

On Friday, 8 May, at 11:00 a.m., nine churches in the Barrie area tolled their bells 75 times in memory of our Second World War Veterans. The joyful peels were heard across Barrie that morning, as they did 75 years earlier, when the fighting in Europe officially ended. Many thanks to Rev Terry Bennett, Jim Laking and Bill & Monika Sergeant for taking part in this tribute. The other Barrie churches were St. Mary's Parish Barrie, St. George's Allandale, Collier St. United Church,

Westside Evangelical Lutheran Church, St John's Anglican Church Craighurst, St Paul's Anglican Church Midhurst, St. Margaret's of Scotland, Burton Ave. United Church.

8. Honours and Awards:

Our Wing would like to congratulate Greg Merrill, Norm Marion and Ken Stacey. In February, 2020, the Governor-General of Canada bestowed the prestigious 'Sovereign's Medal for Volunteers' on those three members.

Greg Merrill has worked with the Ontario Provincial Committee of the Air Cadet League for more than 12 years, where through various positions at the local, regional and provincial level, he has helped run the tow aircraft and glider programs and managed acquisitions and maintenance. He has also been advocating for better resources and services for members of the Veteran's Club of Barrie.

Normand Marion has contributed to the military community of Coldwater since 2000 as a public relations manager, researcher, and fundraiser with various organizations, including the Royal Canadian Legion Branch 270 Coldwater. His investigations into First and Second World War casualties have shed light on the town's military history and helped memorialize those who served.

Ken Stacey has actively contributed to numerous organizations throughout his life including the National Association of Federal Retirees, the Red Cross Meals on Wheels program, the Kiwanis Club of Barrie Golden-K, the Royal Canadian Air Force Association, Royal Canadian Legion and the Veterans' Club of Barrie. The organizations and the communities that they served have benefitted from his leadership and support.



9. RCAF 96th Anniversary Pins:

As has been the tradition at 16 Wing and now within 441 Wing, Norm Marion has shepherded the design and approval of this year's commemorative pin to reality. This year, the Boeing CC-707 aircraft was selected. Many members of the Canadian Forces have stories about this work horse that provided air-to-air refueling for our Northern Flank commitments as well as 'Service Air' travel opportunities for CF members, and at times, their

13. Largest All-Electric Aircraft to Make Maiden Flight - Jack Guy, CNN

As concerns over the environmental cost of flying continue to mount, green propulsion systems can offer an ethical alternative. Electric motor technology is due to reach a new milestone Thursday with the first flight planned of the world's largest all-electric aircraft. The nine-passenger eCaravan plane is the result of a collaboration between engine company magniX and aerospace firm AeroTEC, according to a press release from magniX.

The aircraft, an adapted Cessna Caravan 208B, will make its first flight on May 28 at an airstrip in Washington State at 8 a.m. local time (11 a.m. ET). The original Cessna Caravan is one of the most widely used middle-mile planes in the world, with more than 2,600 aircraft working in 100 countries, the press release states. The all-electric version will use a 750-horsepower (560kW) magni500 propulsion system.

"As the world's largest all-electric aircraft, this first flight is a significant milestone in disrupting the transportation industry and accelerating the electric aviation revolution," reads the press release.

It goes on, "magniX's ultimate goal is to better connect communities by bringing to market an advanced all-electric propulsion system that offers lower cost of operations and zero emissions."
